Read John 9:35-41

- 1. Consider the detail that Jesus 'found' the man. What seems to be the promise there for us? When is a time when you realized that Jesus had sought you out? Was it through another person, through prayer, or some other circumstances?
- 2. This passage has two distinct 'scenes' in it. What is the point of each, and what is significant about having them placed side by side?
- 3. How does this passage and Jesus' words about judgement and condemnation fit with John 3:16–21?
- 4. Metaphorically, we are surrounded by people who claim to see, but do not. Where is your own sight hindered? (See Matthew 7:1–5)

How do you engage with others who are 'blind'?

Scripture passage for May 28

"Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. ² The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. ³ The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. ⁴ When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. ⁵ But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." ⁶ Jesus used this figure of speech, but the Pharisees did not understand what he was telling them.

⁷ Therefore Jesus said again, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. ⁸ All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. ⁹ I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture. ¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.
